Local Government By-Elections

NOTICE OF BY-ELECTIONS

Local government by-elections will be held on **Monday, June 22, 2026**, for the following positions:

Grand Bouctouche (M08)	1 councillor, ward 2
Grand Lake (M15)	3 councillors, ward 2
Nashwaak (M15)	1 councillor, ward 2 1 councillor, ward 7
Saint Andrews (M13)	4 councillors, ward 3-Saint-Andrews

Nominations for these positions can be submitted to the Municipal Returning Officer starting **Friday, May 15**. Nomination papers must be submitted **before 2 p.m. on Friday, May 29**. Nomination papers are available at your local returning office, or they can be printed from our website: www.electionsnb.ca.

Polls will be held on **Monday, June 22, between 10 a.m. and 8 p.m.** for any local government offices if more candidates are nominated than can be elected. **Advance polls** will be held **between 10 a.m. and 8 p.m. on Saturday, June 13**. Electors should receive individual Voter Information Cards in the mail starting on **June 8**, setting out all polling locations for their polling division.

INFORMATION FOR ELECTORS

Getting on the Voters List: A person's name must be on the voters list in order to vote. If you are on the list, you should receive a Voter Information card in the mail starting on June 8. If you have not received a Voter Information card, your name may not be on the list (or not under your current address). You can have your name added to the list by completing an application for addition until June 18, or when you go to vote. If you have moved recently, but have voted before, your name may be on the list at your former address. Call 1 888 858 VOTE (8683) to have your voter information updated.

Who Can Vote? You can vote if you will be at least 18 years old on Election Day, are a Canadian citizen, and have lived in the province for at least 40 days immediately before the date of the by-election and will be ordinarily resident in the local government and ward where you wish to vote on the date of the by-election.

ID for New Voters: To be added to the voters list, you will need one or more pieces of identification which between them show your name, current address, and signature (but not financial or credit cards). A person without sufficient ID may be vouched for by a voter at the polling station whose name is on the voters list for that polling station.

Need More Information? To obtain nomination papers, if you are interested in working at a polling station, for information on special ballot voting for voters unable to go to the polls, or for any other information concerning these by-elections, contact the returning officer for your region as listed above.
