Transparency in Election Commitments

Under the *Transparency in Election Commitments Act*, proclaimed May 16, 2018, any registered political party that makes an election commitment is required to prepare a disclosure statement related to the cost of that commitment. The Act sets out specific timelines by which the disclosure statement must be filed with the Supervisor of Political Financing and published by the party.

Election commitments may be made either by the registered political party or by its leader. Election commitments include a new or expanded program or service, an expenditure reduction measure, a new or expanded revenue program, or a revenue reduction measure.

Legislation

Disclosure Statements

- Applies to all registered political parties
- Applies to “party commitments” and “leader commitments” made, restated, or renewed within **90 days** before ordinary polling day
- Three types of disclosure statements:
 - Cost estimate
 - Maximum cost statement
 - No estimate prepared
- Obligation on party’s official representative to publish and file with Supervisor of Political Financing

Research Support from Legislative Library

- Research services provided
 - during six-month period before ordinary polling day
 - to assist political parties in meeting their obligations
- Director of Library Services
 - entitled to request and receive records from government departments
 - shall take reasonable steps to access other relevant information
- Departments shall respond to Director
 - more than 60 days before ordinary polling day: within 7 days
 - within 60 days before ordinary polling day: within 3 business days

Review Process

- Supervisor to review, within two business days, all disclosure statements for compliance with the Act and its regulations
- Official representative has 24 hours to comply with direction of Supervisor to correct disclosure statement
- Penalties for failure to comply with direction to correct statement:
 - Party prohibited from advertising for remainder of election period
 - Subject to administrative penalty

Complaints Process

- Registered political party may make complaint to Supervisor alleging a failure to file required disclosure statement by another registered political party
- Supervisor must respond to complaint within 72 hours
- If Supervisor determines a disclosure statement must be filed, party must file disclosure statement within 24 hours of being notified

Penalties

- Penalties for failure to comply with direction of Supervisor to file statement:
 - Party prohibited from advertising for remainder of election period
 - Subject to administrative penalty
- Within 30 days after return of writs, registered political party may apply to court for a declaration that another party violated or failed to comply with Act's requirements
 - No later than Monday, December 2, 2024
- If a declaration is made, the party is disqualified from receiving annual allowance until fiscal year after next general election
